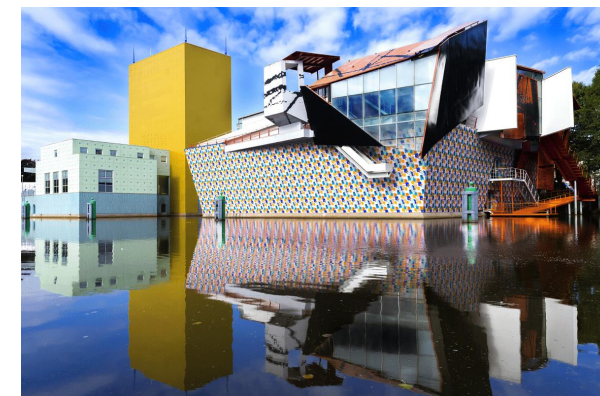

Cultural Institutions and Civil Society
