Catholic and Protestant Churches and the Legacy of World War I

In November 1918 the First World War ended in turmoil or even revolution. Church leaders, both catholic and protestant, had to decide upon rejection or accommodation to these political developments. In Western Europe they preferred accommodation, using the instruments of the existing or newly created Christian-Democratic parties.

Jan Bank is professor emeritus of modern history at Leiden University. In 2016 he published *Churches and Religion in the Second World War* (Bloomsbury).
